I decided to look into history to discover unique individuals and sought after their fingerprints to make this point. Such a person was Jimi Hendrix.

Jimi Hendrix Fingerprints

Jimi Hendrix (1942 - 1970) played the guitar above and beyond the required extend, an ability unparalleled over time. It stands to reason that fingerprint frequencies are noted within his hands. It is clear to see how in this case the Radial Loop fingerprint pattern is associated with rare talent. Jimi Hendrix displayed a Radial Loop on his right and left index fingers. According to the Henry Classification on his fingerprint record, Hendrix's right index fingerprint was a Radial Loop with a ridge count of 12. John Lennon, another musical genius also had a Radial Loop on the right index with a ridge count of 12 [1]. In a study of 17,951,192 males conducted by the FBI in 1993, only 0.920880352 percent of the total, 165,309 individuals displayed a Radial Loop with this distinction [2]. In addition, Hendrix's left index was a Radial Loop with a ridge count of 14; the NCIC FPC=64. This was 98,692 of the total. A percentage rate of 0.549779647. And so, it is noted that Jimi Hendrix being a left-handed guitarist displayed a Radial Loop on the left index at a frequency rarer than the frequency of the Radial Loop on his right index finger. I have noted that President Lyndon B. Johnson also displayed Radial Loops on the right and left index fingers at frequencies less than one percent [3], according to the FBI study cited in this text.




Figure 1. Jimi Hendrix Fingerprints

The right ring finger of Jimi Hendrix was a Central Pocket Loop Type Whorl pattern with an outer tracing. The NCIC FPC is CO. In the referenced FBI study from 1993, 1,348,378 individuals displayed the classification of CO on the right ring finger. Malcolm X also had a classification of CO on the right ring finger [4] which was 7.511356349 percent of the total. Jimi's Left thumb was a Double Loop Whorl pattern with an inner tracing (Figure 1). President John F. Kennedy also displayed a Double Loop Whorl on the left thumb with an inner tracing [5]. The NCIC FPC=DI. This is 2,206,636 individuals from the total of the aforementioned study. It was 12.29242047 percent. Both whorl

patterns from President Kennedy and Jimi Hendrix were counterclockwise in appearance! A listing of frequencies is referenced [6].
